Court reprieve

THE High Court last night threw Julia Gillard's asylum seeker swap deal into disarray when it blocked today's first

transfer of boat people to Malaysia.

The Federal Government will sweat on a second ruling from the High Court this afternoon after a judge last night dramatically granted an injunc-

tion preventing the deportation of asylum seekers before 4.15pm today.
Sixteen single men from the first asylum boat subject to the Gillard Government's so-called Malaysian solution were due to

fly out to the Malaysian capital Kuala Lumpur at II.30am.
However, Justice Kenneth Hayne ordered that the 16 men not depart Australia before 4.15pm, pending the hearing of another application in the High

Court in Canberra at 2.15pm. The proceedings were launched by lawyer David Manne from the Refugee and Immigration Legal Centre at a special court hearing in Melbourne last night.

The lawyers, who represent more than 40 asylum seekers, argue sending the group to Malaysia is unlawful.

The Gillard Government has yowed to defend the case.
