A taste of show keeps Ekka spirit alive

The spirit of the Royal Queensland Show (Ekka) will be kept alive this year with a reimagined version set to bring a taste of some of Ekka's unique traditions, following the cancellation of Queensland's largest event due to COVID-19.

More than two months in the making, Ekka 2020 Online presented by RACQ offers a 10-day program showcasing our farmers, competitions, traditions, animals, food, entertainment and agricultural education in an exciting and interactive format.

The public will also get a taste of the iconic Ekka Strawberry Sundaes and Dagwood Dogs with special drive through outlets operating at the Brisbane Showgrounds; pop up sites around Brisbane and the first ever Do It Yourself Ekka Strawberry Sundae packs.

RNA Chief Executive Brendan Christou said while the show can't go on in its normal format, Ekka 2020 Online is about paying tribute and homage to an event that has united more than 32 million Queenslanders from the country to the city since 1876.

"It will bring people together online to interact, educate, engage and share memories in a year that will go down in history," he said.

"Only twice before in the Ekka's 144-year history has the show been cancelled – in 1919 due to Spanish Influenza and in 1942 – due to World War 2.

"When we announced the cancellation of the show, we wanted to ensure people could still get a taste of the show not just through online engagement but also ensuring our iconic strawberry sundaes were available."

Ten unique channels across ekka.com.au, social media platforms plus an XP Esports league city versus country Young Farmers Challenge will bring interactive content to life to entertain, educate, engage, and showcase the People's Show.

From a virtual baby animal nursery streamed daily to fireworks to meeting our farmers to learning top tricks from some of Ekka's most successful exhibitors, it will offer a smorgasbord of show staples.

Mr Christou said Ekka 2020 Online would also feature several competitions that have been modified due to COVID-19 plus offering an insight into how our competitors achieve the best of the best.

"Importantly it will continue to bridge the city / country divide by educating Queenslanders on the vital role agriculture plays in their everyday lives," he said.

A special one-off fireworks display will take place on Ekka eve to signal the 10 days of Ekka 2020 Online kicking off and to thank Queenslanders for their amazing support this year. The Fullscreen Fireworks will be broadcast exclusively live on the Seven Network.

Join us for an online 10-day celebration of agriculture, tune in daily to see the animals, pop in for a sundae, learn from the best of the best and hear first-hand from farmers why agriculture is so important – from the food you eat to the clothes you wear. EKKA COMPETITIONS - Some of our beloved competitions are continuing this year despite the show cancellation:

- YOUNG FARMERS XP ESPORTS CUP presented by Arrow Energy Ekka, with the support of Presenting Partner Arrow Energy, has teamed up with XP Esports to present Young Farmers XP Esports Cup: An Esports tournament championing agriculture for the younger generations. Over 2 days, 4 regional and 4 city schools will compete using the PC game Farming Simulator. An Esports extension of the Young Farmers Challenge shown at the Ekka, the Young Farmers XP Esports Cup is the first official Australian tournament for popular esports game Farming Simulator.
- PADDOCK TO PALATE presented by JBS
 The nation's richest beef competition of its kind with almost \$65,000 in prize money on offer is continuing as planned. This includes classes 37, 38, 40 & 39 (2019/20 Wagyu Challenge).
- LED STEER COMPETITION
 The Led Steer Competition is running in a modified format, featuring only Hook classes (no Hoof).
 There's double the prize money on offer a total of more than \$13,000 up for grabs. Judging will be carried out by qualified Aus-Meat chiller assessors on Wednesday 5 August.



PRIME BEEF COMPETITION

The Prime Beef Competition is taking place in a new location this year. Judging and the prime beef sale will be held at Silverdale Saleyards in Queensland's Scenic Rim on Thursday 6 August. The Prime Beef Competition classes include grain and pasture-fed and Japanese chiller trade, with more than \$12,000 in prize money up for grabs.

DIGITAL PHOTOGRPAHY COMPETITION

Those with an eye for photography can submit their work in the new Digital Photography Competition. It features seven classes, with most mirroring the classes available in last year's Ekka Photography Competition. There is also a brand-new Ekka Memories class, judged by people's choice. The competition also features a Student Photography class that recognises and rewards the next generation of passionate photographers. This is an online competition only (no prints will be accepted).

BUSH POETRY COMPETITION

The Bush Poetry Competition is going online this year. Poets of all ages are invited to submit a recording of themselves performing their best original or favourite established poem showcasing the Australian way of life. The time limit is four minutes and there are both Open and School classes to enter.

WOOL COMPETITION

The Wool Competition is taking place in a new location this year. Judging will be held at the Baynham Woolshed in Mitchell on Monday 20 July. The competition is open to fibre producers of skirted fleeces and features 10 classes covering both flock and stud.

YOUNG JUDGES COMPETITION

The Young Judges Competition presented by Arrow Energy is moving online this year. It will feature classes in stud beef, led steer, dairy cattle, dairy goats, sheep, horses, and poultry. Each class will be made up of four animals, with still shots and videos taken of each animal. The young judges will view the images and videos and will then rank the animals from 1-4 based on criteria including their features and standing confirmation. The young judges will submit their ranking online, along with a maximum three-minute video outlining their reasoning for the order.
